

CSIF and imagineNATIVE 7th ANNUAL MENTORSHIP PROGRAM: CALL FOR APPLICANTS in ALBERTA

Application Deadline: Friday, January 10th, 2020

Calling all Indigenous filmmakers – expand your filmmaking experience by creating a 5-10 min short with the CSIF/imagineNATIVE Mentorship!

This mentorship is an opportunity to create a new short work (5-10 min), to premiere at the **annual imagineNATIVE Film + Media Arts Festival in Toronto (October 20-25, 2020)**.

Create a short film from concept to completion while working closely with CSIF staff and an Indigenous mentor. Open to all genres.

The selected recipient will be provided with:

- a 1 year CSIF Membership
- eligibility to enrol in any training workshops offered during CSIF's Winter and Summer 2020 Calendar
- Mentorship from an Indigenous mentor, pending their availability
- Support, mentorship, and the use of equipment (production and editing) from CSIF
- \$5,100 as an artist fee
- \$4,000 for crew
- \$2,500 for production
- \$500 for on-set craft (food + beverages)

Please note: Projects must be realistic in scope within the services provided by the residency and must be completed and be delivered as a digital file to imagineNATIVE by September 9, 2020.

Eligibility Criteria:

• This call is open to Indigenous (First Nation, Métis, Inuit) candidates residing in or around Calgary only

• Candidates are strongly encouraged to attend CSIF training workshops (schedule to be determined upon selection). We strongly encourage applicants who are independent, deadline driven and self-starters

• You must live in Calgary or within commuting distance from the city in order to access CSIF workshops and equipment. Travel subsidy and cost of living are NOT covered by this mentorship.

Your Application Must Include:

- ¹/₂ to 1 page film treatment
 - Production schedule that demonstrates the project will be completed on time
 - Budget that demonstrates the project can be completed within the scope of this mentorship
 - ¹/₂ to 1 page statement on why you'd like to participate and how you would benefit from participation
 - Your bio (no CVs or resumes, please). Please be sure to indicate past experience with film and other artistic mediums, if any, and your Indigenous affiliation
 - Contact info including name, address, email address, and phone number
